

## "WE MAKE WHAT WE WANT VILLE"

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<b>Values</b>	Your country and economic system reflects values which center on rugged individualism. It is up to each person to make him or herself prosperous. Your country produces whatever brings the highest price and produces it with the method that costs the least. Individual rewards and material incentives are used to encourage and stimulate continuous economic growth and production.
<b>Goals</b>	To produce whatever your group decides will be most beneficial for it. You will also want to organize yourselves so you can make the most efficient use of time and resources. Maximized profit is the key.
<b>Situation</b>	With your present limited resources of string, beads, ruler, and scissors, you can create rings, necklaces, or bracelets. Your group gets \$10 (dollars) for a necklace, \$5 (dollars) for a bracelet and \$2 (dollars) for a ring. Your group produces whatever it wants.
<b>Production Process</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>&gt; It is up to you to organize your group and choose jobs in whatever fashion you want. Roles include:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Maker - draws the string for the items</li><li>• Bead drawer - uses the tool to draw empty circles to represent beads (these are not placed on the string - draw them in a pile.)</li><li>• Bead color filler - Fills the empty circles with color (these are not placed on the string - fill them in the pile from the Bead Drawer).</li><li>• Bead stringer - Moves the color-filled beads from the pile and places on the string.</li><li>• Quality control - Reviews item for quality (uniform bead size, no extra string, etc.)</li></ul></li><li>&gt; A ring must be made from a piece of string with 4 beads in this sequence: 1 red, 1 yellow, 1 blue, and 1 green.</li><li>&gt; A bracelet must be made from a piece of string with 8 beads on it in this sequence: 2 red, 2 yellow, 2 blue, and 2 green.</li><li>&gt; A necklace is made with a piece of string and 10 beads in this sequence: 3 yellow, 3 blue, 2 green, and 2 red.</li><li>&gt; The finished product is then inspected by the quality control person who marks down the dollar amount. Any adjustments to the product are made by the maker.</li><li>&gt; Your group will be paid in full for as many of the items as you can produce within the time limit.</li></ul>
